Welcome to the Geriatric Assessment Unit (GAU) – A1

We're located at the Ottawa Hospital, Civic Campus on the first floor

The GAU is designed to help older adults regain their independence while also managing their health care problems. The team members will help you and your family to set goals and work with you to achieve them. We will provide you with recommendations to help you remain as independent as possible.

Our team members include: Geriatrician, Nurse, Occupational Therapist, Physiotherapist, Social Worker, Speech and Language Pathologist, Dietician, Pharmacist, Rehabilitation Assistant and Volunteers. **You** are the most important member of the team.

What to Expect of your Stay

This is a different type of hospital unit. You will be asked to get dressed in the morning and spend your day up and out of bed. By doing a little more each day you will help your recovery and get you back into your routine.

We encourage you to participate in planned therapies each day. These will also help you increase your independence.

During the day you may also be scheduled for various tests, assessments and treatments with team members.

We ask that visitors follow these times to allow us to work with you during the daytime hours.

A hairdresser is available on request. You will be asked to pay by cash or cheque.

DISCHARGE PLANNING

A conference with you and your family may be arranged if required to discuss the team's assessments and recommendations.

When you are ready for discharge, a detailed report will be sent to your family physician who is responsible for your continuing care.

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
